ACCOLADES TO THE CADETS

VERY IMPORTANT- May 22

May 22 is the final Concert Season Meeting after the Spring Concert AND official start of SUMMER MARCHING TRIMESTER. ALL CADETS MUST ATTEND. Band members arrive at 6 PM to do returns, etc.

- Return sheet music for <u>Dancin on the Bayou</u>, check it in at designated spot at table
- MANDATORY Return/check-in of all WSHSB rental/loaner instruments (Cadets too) for the ANNUAL INSTRUMENT INVENTORY/CHECK even if you plan to re-rent one
- Return of any/all other band property
- Summer marching music and hat distribution,
- Music filing/organizing by parent volunteers
- 7:30 Preliminary marching practice bring your instrument, lyre and flip-folder
- 8:30 9:30 pm Audition Questions and Answers with Mrs. Borow

Cadet families, please continue to check the weekly notes for audition announcements, as well as other important dates and deadlines.

NOTE TO CADET PARENTS: It would be good to review last year's, 2013-2014 Junior audition requirements (currently on the website) with your student. The 2014-2015 audition requirements will be updated in the next couple weeks. While there will be changes, it will be productive to have them start practicing now with the current requirements. **Reminder:** Correctly performing rhythms is a large factor in audition results and overall progression as a musician. It is <u>essential</u> for those interested in placing higher within any band or moving up a band.

CADET FAMILIES ARE INVITED

Friday, May 16, is the night of the Spring Concert at the Edman Chapel at Wheaton College, Wheaton, IL. We hope you will be able to attend. If that date does not work you may attend the dress rehearsal on Thursday, May 15, but you would need to through the door on the north side of the building, adjacent to the parking lot. On the night of the concert, only band members use this back door. All other family members and concertgoers must enter the auditorium through Edman's main doors. See the Forms/Documents webpage for directions to Edman Chapel. We hope to see you there.

Notes to Junior, Senior, and Symphonic bands – RAMP UP PRACTICE TIMES

The director asks that all members ramp up their practice times until the concert. Concentrate on eliminating the many wrong notes still being played, observe and obey the dynamic markings, practice hitting the high, difficult notes, correct your rhythms, and play with the recordings. She would like to focus on fine tuning the songs, playing them through without having to stop for the same old errors.

DRUMLINE PRACTICE

May 8, from 5:00 to 6pm is a Summer Marching percussion drumline practice. Make sure you are on time. The next drumline practice will be **May 29** from 6:30 to 7:30pm.

CONCERT PROGRAM PROOFING

Junior, Senior and Symphonic need to check concert program proof sheets at the front table at practice We need <u>every band member</u> to check the spelling of their name, their band(s) and instrument(s). Make corrections if necessary or email the director. This will help avoid errors in the concert program.

REGARDING COMBINED SONGS

The director expects any Senior or Symphonic member, while waiting for their band to begin, to play along with any combined band song being rehearsed by another band.

ATTENTION ALL PERCUSSIONISTS - For combined songs each member must play the parts as assigned in the percussion book.

Nick K, Zack K and Joshua H are responsible to use the SECTIONAL time to ensure that ALL percussion music is in the correct order in ALL the folders for a smooth and quick transition from song to song.

CONCERT REMINDERS FOR ALL

- Attention all Second Chair people With bad weather and all the flu and cold bugs going around at
 this time of year there can be many unexpected absences. All SECOND CHAIR people need to practice
 all solos in case the FIRST chair becomes ill and cannot make the concert.
- Break in new reeds now Do not expect to perform well at the concert with a brand new reed. You
 must have a couple reeds already BROKEN-IN prior to the dress rehearsal. Have more than one ready
 in case of breakage.
- 3. Put your music in concert order as listed in these notes
- 4. Cummerbunds and bowties Cummerbunds and bow ties will be distributed at practice on May 8. Band members must stop by the front table to pick up what is needed for their highest band. Everyone wears a bow tie. Concert Senior and Symphonic also wear a cummerbund. Do not just help yourself, but see one of the moms at the table.

- 5. Review Dress Code and check fit of clothes NOW shirt, pants, etc Remember, FULL CONCERT DRESS is to be worn to Dress Rehearsal and you will be observed for compliance
- 6. Lyre and Flip Folders needed for Concert Standing wind musicians from Concert Junior, Concert Senior and Symphonic need to use a lyre and flip-folder at the Winter Concert. Be sure to label. Under **no circumstances** should it be cut to fit! Rather photocopy and reduce it.
 - Symphonic for Star Spangled Banner. All play from the BLUE (Bb) side.
 - Concert Junior and Concert Senior for God Bless America, and Our Director
- 7. About those tapping feet The sound of people tapping their feet to help keep time can be very apparent during rehearsals in Cornelius Hall, which has a SOLID, CONCRETE floor. This sound is magnified when on a stage that is hollow underneath as at Edman. Just lift your toes and do not tap the ball of your foot.

MISTAKES HAPPEN

It was noted by audience members at a past concert that it was apparent someone up front had made a mistake. The audience knew because the player made a face and moved about in some way showing their disappointment. This should never happen. Everyone makes a mistake sometime but nothing outward should be noticed by the audience. Good showmanship dictates to just continue playing and the moment will pass, overshadowed by the entire piece.

ALL CONCERT BANDS - CONDUCT AT REMAINING PRACTICES

For our remaining practices thru the Dress Rehearsal and Concert it is the director's goal to play through all songs without stopping. All band members, in every section, will be expected to conduct themselves as if they are at the Concert. Although we will not be in "Concert Dress", there is no reason we cannot behave as though we are. If we do this now it should make the actual dress rehearsal go very smoothly. This includes things such as:

- Make sure you have tuned before you sit down
- Observe concert demeanor with **no talking**, as if on stage. This includes between songs too.
- Hold your instrument properly while waiting for the director to step on the podium.
- Sit erect and bring your instrument up as the director mounts the podium.
- Bring instrument to your mouth when director raises her arms.
- Sit upright on your chair, both feet on the floor, without your back touching the backrest while playing. Do not slouch in your chair during long rests.

Do not swab your instrument or empty spit valves, etc. If you must yawn, do so discreetly.
