**LAST WEEK TO RETURN MUSIC ON 11/17** - Read in Music Notes about returning music now or waiting until after the concert.

## CONCERT DRESS REQUIRED

The Cadet Dress Rehearsal is December 1 and the Performance is on December 8 and **ALL band members must come to BOTH dressed in CONCERT DRESS** which includes a plain, button-front white shirt/blouse buttoned to the neck, and black pants/skirt and shoes. Refer to the Handbook for complete specifics regarding socks, panty hose, and acceptable/unacceptable clothing styles. We will be observing your dress for compliance.

*At the remaining pre-performance rehearsal we will practice using podium etiquette as used at the concert*  
*Director steps off podium – Instruments down*  
*Director steps on podium – Instruments upright, to one side*  
*Director raises arms – Instruments up in playing position*

## ABOUT ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS “MY EE LIBRARY”

First of all, a reminder that both the older and newest versions of Essential Elements have the same contents and exercises. The difference is the older versions came with a CD or DVD/CD ROM which are still worthwhile. However, for the newest version, all tools and features are accessible online or you can order the CD Rom for free if you prefer.

Either way, anyone can use the tools available online at **Hal Leonard’s Essential Elements My Library**. Included are play-along tracks for all the exercises #1-187, the start-up video, additional music and a listening library all for your specific instrument.

Go to [myEElibrary](#). If you have the newer title, **Essential Elements for Band**, there is a student code on the title page of the book to enter in the student activation code box. If you have the older version, **Essential Elements 2000**, click where it says “My Book Doesn’t Have a Code.” On the next page that opens you will enter the 10 or 13 digit ISBN from the book you do have and you will be able to access all the features listed above. The ISBN code also gets you to the correct instrument.

## Notes to Junior, Senior, and Symphonic bands –

**BRING TUNERS** - If you own a tuner, bring it each week and tune your instrument before your band time begins. Tuners are also available at the front table.

**METRONOME** - Use a metronome in your daily practice.

**CRESCENDOS** – The director asks that all start to play crescendos quieter and gradually get louder. Some make the mistake of thinking "loud" right away when they see a crescendo and then there is nowhere louder left to go. When you see a crescendo think "soft" and then build.

### LST CHANCE FOR RETURNING MUSIC 11/17

Only if you have made working copies for yourself, you may still return originals on 11/17 at the front tables. Keep either the original or a copy of EVERY song distributed this trimester whether or not it has been cut from the concert. Return music in alphabetical order within band. Clip together with your name on a piece of paper. After 11/17 no music may be returned until the regular collection day, the Thursday after our winter concert.

## GENERAL NOTES

### WHEATON LIGHT-A-HOLIDAY PARADE

Friday, November 25 is the Wheaton Light-A-Holiday Parade. We remind you that **all Cadets** as well as **parents and siblings of any band member** are welcome to march with us, behind the band. If you have jingle bells bring them along to shake while you are marching.

- **ALL participants must wear a traditional, plain, Santa hat made of fake fur, red with white trim** (large enough to cover ears is good) and normal winter dress outerwear for the parade – dress for the weather.
- **Wear dark pants and, ideally, black shoes, to keep a uniform look.**
- Mittens that allow you to uncover your fingers would be helpful, or perhaps a pair of gloves with the fingertips cut off, for clarinets. Try playing your instrument at home while wearing them.
- Some find it helpful to bring a bunch of their own **HAND-WARMER PACKETS** in their pockets for keeping both their hands and instruments warm.
- Bring your **FLIP-FOLDER AND LYRE**, loaded with the songs we are performing.
- A battery-operated clip-light or headband-style light will improve your reading/seeing the music in the dark.
- Those with larger instruments, such as tubas, sousaphones and percussion, please consider decorating your instrument with a battery-operated string of Christmas lights. This is not required but, if you are able to do so, it adds a festive touch to the band's appearance.

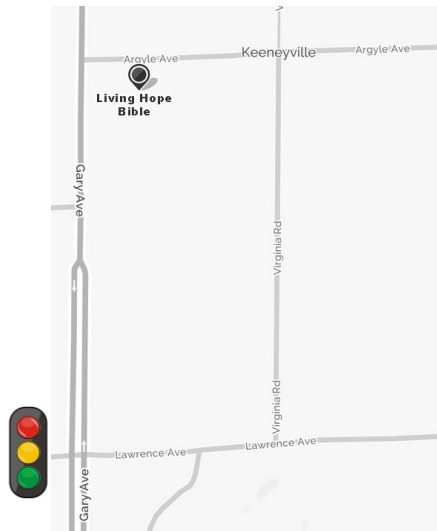
We will gather at 5pm in the parking lot behind Wheaton's City Hall (NW corner of Wesley St and Wheaton Ave). Step-off is 6pm. **We are unit 46.** The preferred way to enter the parking lot/staging area is to go south on Wheaton Avenue. Do not try to enter the staging area from Hale or Wesley Streets, as you will be redirected. If needed, look for a Wheaton Police Officer or Parade Staging Marshall in an Orange Vest for instructions. We will disburse at the Wheaton Public Library, near the southwest corner of the library (near Wesley and Cross Streets).

### POST-PARADE GATHERING

There will be a gathering immediately after the parade at the Portillo's/Barnelli's on North Avenue, one business east of the McDonalds on the southeast corner of North Avenue and Bloomingdale Road in Glendale Heights. It will be nice to have more time to be together since we will get there so much earlier than after a concert.

**DRIVING DIRECTIONS FOR DECEMBER 8** - On December 8 the Cadet Performance and all rehearsals will be held at Living Hope Bible Church, 6N171 Gary Ave, Roselle. It is on the east side of Gary just north of Schick Road/Stratford Square and south of Lake St. (Rt. 20).

**FOR EXITING SAFELY** – There is no light at the corner of Argyle Avenue and Gary Avenue where the church is located and left turns can be more dangerous. There is a light at Gary, one block south of the church on Lawrence. Exit the parking lot to the right, turn right on Virginia and right onto Lawrence to the light at Gary.



### REGARDING OUTERWEAR JACKETS

The temperature is cooling and there now brand new coat racks in Cornelius Hall. Everyone is to hang their jacket on the coat rack. Do not leave it with your instrument case. **MAKE SURE YOUR JACKET IS LABELED!**
