Notes to Junior, Senior, and Symphonic bands –

ALL CONCERT BANDS - CONDUCT AT REMAINING PRACTICES

For our remaining practices thru the Dress Rehearsal and Concert it is the director's goal to play through all songs without stopping. All band members, in every section, will be expected to conduct themselves as if they are at the Concert. Although we will not be in "Concert Dress", there is no reason we cannot behave as though we are. If we do this now it should make the actual dress rehearsal go very smoothly. This includes things such as:

- Make sure you have tuned before you sit down.
- Observe concert demeanor with **no talking**, as if on stage. This includes between songs too.
- Hold your instrument properly while waiting for the director to step on the podium.
- Sit erect and bring your instrument up as the director mounts the podium.
- Bring instrument to your mouth when director raises her arms.
- Sit upright on your chair, both feet on the floor, without your back touching the backrest while playing.
- Do not look around, hang your head down or slouch in your chair during long rests. You should sit still like a statue, facing the director. This is especially true during the solo performance in Symphonic. The slightest movements can be a distraction to the audience.

SPRING CONCERT TICKETS AND FLYERS

Thank you again to Anthony Warmack for designing our Spring Concert flyers and tickets. Both will be available, starting next week, at band and on our website (**Forms/Documents** and **Member's News**). Make sure people know that while there are printed tickets, they are not necessary for entrance to the concert.

If every band family would post flyers we would have **hundreds of** flyers posted. If some are able to do more, that's even better. **Post them at homeschool co-ops like Greenhouse and G.I.F.T.** In addition to libraries, think of other places with community bulletin boards, such as banks, churches, park districts, grocery stores, photo copy places etc., and ask them to post flyers. **We are depending on you** to post as many flyers as possible, wherever you can get permission.

CONCERT PREPARATIONS

ALL CONCERT BANDS - Check the fit of your concert shirts and pants or skirts, etc. DO NOT WAIT UNTIL CONCERT WEEK. Cadets will need concert dress for their 5/3 Dress Rehearsal and 5/10 Performance. Juniors through Sym will also need lyres and flip folders for the dress rehearsal and concert on 5/17 and 5/18.

Any band awards that you want to wear on your uniform MUST BE ATTACHED TO THE RED AWARD RIBBON. Attach the red award ribbon to the top, left side of your shirt (or jacket) even with the point of your collar. Ribbon replacement fee is \$1. There is an **EXCEPTION FOR ONLY SYMPHONIC GRADUATING SENIORS**; – You may wear awards anywhere on the upper left breast of the jacket, with no medal lower than the bottom edge of the pocket. Nothing should be on the lapel or sleeve.
