The Cadet Dress Rehearsal is April 25 at Resurrection in Cornelius Hall and the Performance is on May 2 in MARVIN HALL at Resurrection, up the stairs just inside the regular entrance.

#### ALL band members must come to BOTH dressed in CONCERT DRESS.

All cadets must **arrive at 4:15** for both the Dress Rehearsal and the concert to assist with unloading and set-up so they can be in their seats ready to play by 5:00 at which time we will tune the band. (See item above about help needed requiring earlier arrival time.) **CONCERT DRESS** includes a plain, button-front white shirt/blouse buttoned to the neck, and black pants/skirt and shoes. Refer to the Handbook, page 14, or the Dress Code on our Forms Documents page, for complete specifics regarding socks, panty hose and acceptable/unacceptable clothing styles. We will be observing your dress for compliance.

#### IF YOU ARE NOT DRESSED ACCORDING TO THE DRESS CODE OR ARE LATE YOU MAY NOT BE ALLOWED TO PERFORM.

# **SUMMER MARCHING**

### The Marching Registration to be completed ONLINE. The link will NOT be on our website.

Mrs. Borow sent an email on 4/15 with the ONLINE registration link for marching camp, all parades and both football games. Music distribution will be based on your responses.

Summer Marching Registration Deadline is April 25.

ALL eight (8) camp days – both pre-camp and Full Camp – will be held at the **DuPage County Fairgrounds**, from 9am to 12 noon.

We need a registration for every band member in every family, marching or not. If not marching, there are only a few things to complete on the first page and then skip through to Summer Instrument Rental where a Y or N is required. "Submit" button is last.

To help in planning your summer activities, below are requirement reminders and some dates associated with Summer Marching. Know that newly graduated Cadets may join us for Summer Marching.

#### **REQUIREMENT REMINDERS**

- 1. If you want to march in parades, football performances, etc., you MUST come to camp, period. If you (students only) can't make camp, you don't march or perform at games. See **NOTE** below.
- 2. All marching musicians are expected to participate in the preliminary marching practice on May 23. Drumline has an additional practice on May 30.
- 3. All participants must march a minimum of 2 parades. See NOTE below.
- 4. If you are unsure or anticipate the possibility that you may need to cancel on a parade date or dates, it is better not to sign-up for any questionable dates. Rather, if you find you become available for a parade call Mrs. Borow the week before the parade and she will let you know if she can fit you in the block. Fitting someone in is far more preferable than dealing with a cancellation and having a hole in the block.

**NOTE:** If someone has a conflict with point 1 or 2, they will need to talk to Mrs. Borow directly. She will handle conflicts on a case-by-case basis. PLEASE DO NOT DISCUSS THIS WITH HER ON A BAND NIGHT.

#### VERY IMPORTANT

If you plan on participating in ANY event of the entire marching season (parade, football games, etc.) **you need to attend camp** where the marching music for the entire marching season is finalized and distributed. It's very difficult to distribute music after the fact, especially for additional performances. It doesn't mean you are doing every performance but at least you will have the music without individual distribution.

### DATES TO KNOW

April 15 – MONDAY - Marching trimester, BOOSTER VOLUNTEER JOBS to be RELEASED at 7pm. First come, first served. ONLINE Marching registration emailed to ALL on 4/15.

#### April 25 – THURSDAY – Online Marching Registration DEADLINE Summer rental forms and fees are DUE

May 23 - THURSDAY AFTER CONCERT - Final Concert Season Meeting after the Spring Concert AND Official start of SUMMER MARCHING TRIMESTER which includes the FIRST MARCHING PRACTICE, THE ANNUAL INSTRUMENT INVENTORY/CHECK, MUSIC RETURN, CORPUS CHRISTI REHEARSAL and more.

All marching musicians are expected to participate in this preliminary marching practice. CADETS MUST ALSO ATTEND to return sheet music and if they have rental instruments!!

May 30 – THURSDAY- Special Opportunity, no sign-up required, simply show-up

TWO one hour, rhythm classes, wind with percussion

All are welcome to take advantage before starting summer audition prep The two rhythm classes are one each for the "Gold" EE book and "Red" EE book These two simultaneous rhythm classes are 5-6pm. Winds are done at 6. From 6 to 7pm there is drumline practice to prepare for marching. All marching percussionists must attend this drumline practice.

#### June 12, 13, 14 - MANDATORY PRE-CAMPS at DuPage County Fair Grounds, 9am to 12pm each day Enter off Manchester, via Gate S7 at the SE corner of the Fairgrounds

- 6/12 Newcomer Camp for all students new to WSHSB Marching Band (helpers welcome)
- 6/13 Percussion Camp required for all current and new marching percussionists
- 6/14 Rank Leader Camp for those who've been rank leaders before and volunteer

to offer their services in the training of new marchers, also Senior or Symphonic band members interested in being a rank leader.

Attendance on this day **WILL NOT GUARANTEE** your role as a rank leader in marching camp or at parades.

The director will decide and assign rank leaders based on multiple criteria including: actual marching ability, leadership skills, marching camp attendance as well as prior AND current parade commitments.

June 6/17 through 6/21 – FULL MARCHING BAND CAMP at DuPage County Fair Grounds,

9am to 12pm each day. Enter off Manchester, via Gate S7 at the SE corner of the Fairgrounds

#### PARADES

We are marching in four parades -

Geneva Swedish Days – Sunday, June 23. Arrive no later than noon. Step-off 1pm.

Warrenville Independence Day Parade - Wednesday, July 3. Arrive no later than 5. Step-off 6pm.

Streamwood Summer Celebration – Saturday, July 27. Arrive no later than 9:30. Step-off 10:30am.

Elk Grove Village Hometown Parade – Saturday, September 21. Arrive no later than 1.

Step-off 2pm.

We will be playing for two Crossroads football games on September 28 and October 12.

Locations and times to be announced.

**NOTE:** Playing for potential football games is open to ONLY those who have participated in marching band.
