# VERY IMPORTANT- Cadets must come on May 23

May 23 is the final Concert Season Meeting after the Spring Concert AND official start of SUMMER MARCHING TRIMESTER. ALL CADETS MUST ATTEND. Band members arrive at 6:00pm to do returns, etc. All marching percussionists must arrive earlier at 5:00pm for Summer Marching drumline practice.

- 6:00 7:30pm Return completed Cadet Music Return Form along with sheet music for <u>Vandivere</u> <u>Fanfare, Dragon Slayer, and Dancin' on the Bayou</u>. The fine for any full size missing music is \$4.00. You are expected to pay your fines when you return your music. Come prepared to do so.
- MANDATORY Return/check-in (Cadets included) of all WSHSB rental/loaner instruments (whether keeping or returning) for the ANNUAL INSTRUMENT INVENTORY/CHECK.
- Return of any/all other band property
- Music filing/organizing by parent volunteers
- Approx. 7:30pm Cadets coming to marching camp MUST ATTEND on 5/23 for preliminary marching camp practice. Bring your instrument, lyre and flip-folder loaded with your music

Those not marching may leave after they have completed their return(s).

**NOTE TO CADET PARENTS:** The sooner you start this, the better. Review the Junior audition requirements with your student. It would be most productive to have them start practicing now. At the top of our Audition webpage see the document "Suggested Strategy for Auditioning." *Reminder:* Correctly performing rhythms is a large factor in audition results and overall progression as a musician. It is <u>essential</u> for those interested in placing higher within any band or moving up a band.

# Notes to Junior, Senior, and Symphonic bands -

- **POST CONCERT FLYERS AND DISTRIBUTE TICKETS** They are available at band and on our website. Make sure people know that while there are printed tickets, they are not necessary for entrance to the concert. We are depending on you to post as many flyers as possible, wherever you can get permission.
- LYRES AND FLIP FOLDER'S FOR CONCERT Most standing wind musicians from JR, SR and SYM will need a lyre and flip folder to hold their music for playing while standing at the concert. Listen at band for specifics.
- ANY BAND AWARDS that you want to wear on your uniform MUST BE ATTACHED TO THE RED AWARD RIBBON. Attach the red award ribbon to the top, left side of your shirt (or jacket) even with the point of your collar. Ribbon replacement fee is \$1. All awards must fit on ribbons!

There is an **EXCEPTION FOR ONLY SYMPHONIC GRADUATING SENIORS**; – You may wear awards anywhere on the upper left breast of the jacket, with no medal lower than the bottom edge of the pocket. Nothing should be on the collar, lapel or sleeve

### ALL CONCERT BANDS - CONDUCT AT REMAINING PRACTICES

For our remaining practices thru the Dress Rehearsal and Concert it is the director's goal to play through all songs without stopping. All band members, in every section, will be expected to conduct themselves as if they are at the Concert. Although we will not be in "Concert Dress", there is no reason we cannot behave as though we are. If we do this now it should make the actual dress rehearsal go very smoothly. This includes things such as:

- Make sure you have tuned before you sit down.
- Observe concert demeanor with **no talking**, as if on stage. This includes between songs too.
- Hold your instrument properly while waiting for the director to step on the podium.
- Sit erect and bring your instrument up as the director mounts the podium.
- Bring instrument to your mouth when director raises her arms.
- Sit upright on your chair, both feet on the floor, without your back touching the backrest while playing.
- Do not look around, hang your head down or slouch in your chair during long rests. You should sit still
  like a statue, facing the director. This is especially true during the solo performances in Symphonic. The
  slightest movements can be a distraction to the audience.

# **PUT MUSIC IN ORDER**

The song order below, for each band, is concert order.

ALL WIND PLAYERS – Sheet music should already be in concert order ALL PERCUSSIONISTS - Put music in all folders and CUBE in concert order during sectional. See the list under each band.

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We will use podium etiquette at all rehearsals through the Concert Director steps off podium – Instruments down Director steps on podium – Instruments upright, to one side Director raises arms – Instruments up in playing position

Junior (see notes above)

ATTENTION ALL JUNIOR BAND MEMBERS – MAY 9

The director wishes remind the ENTIRE Junior Band to arrive early on May 9.

On **May 9** there is no Cadet rehearsal. The director will need assistance from the entire Junior band and Junior parents, to do the set-up normally done every week by Cadets and their parents.

At 5:00 all Junior percussionists and Junior percussion parents who are there must

- 1. Help unload the trailer
- 2. Carry in the unloaded percussion equipment
- 3. Assist the director in setting-up all percussion equipment in the section.

At **5:00** all **Junior wind players and Junior wind parents**, must assist the parent-in-charge in setting-up chairs in Cornelius hall. When finished, they should help carry in any music files and remaining percussion equipment.

ALL ARE EXPECTED TO HELP

When all set-up is completed, Junior percussion will have a sectional to put their music in order.

SECTIONALS – When ALL set-up is done until 6pm – Percussion - All music in folders and CUBE must be put in concert order and remain in order through the concert 5:45–6:00pm – UNDER STAIRS – French horns on <u>Sunnyland</u> Do not stand on stairs or landing! Use only the area under the stairwell.
