GENERAL NOTES

REHEARSAL NOTES ARCHIVE – can be a help when you are trying to recall something you saw in past Rehearsal Notes. We try to cut down on repeating items in the notes. Each week's notes remain available on our website in the Archive.

IDEAS FOR PASSING TIME - In the past moms of small children wondered what to do/where to go during band time. Suggestions we've received include the following list. Please let us know if any have changed or you have something to add.

- Bring some popcorn and a good exciting book and read out loud in the car. There are great biographies
 of missionaries and leaders of the faith written for younger ages. We can never seem to squeeze in
 enough time to do family reading, and this 'forced down time' could offer that.
- There is a Wal-Mart just east of the Charlestown Mall and a Jewel to the west on Kirk Rd. It is fairly close (5.6 mi @10 min). Take Rt. 59 to North Avenue. Go west and it is on the right (north) side of the street, just past Pheasant Run Resort.
- Some prefer to go east on Army Trail Road past County Farm Road to Costco (4.5 mi @7 min) (closes 8:30, gas station closes 9:30) and an Aldi (closes 8pm). There is also a Jewel at Army Trail and County Farm Roads (3.2 mi @5 min).
- Bartlett Library (closes 9pm) is at 800 S. Bartlett Road (3.5 mi, @8 min).
- NE corner of Rt 59 and Army Trail
 - Starbucks (closes 8pm)
 - Atlas Chicken (closes 8:30)
 - Beef Shack (closes 9pm).
- SE corner of Rt 59 and Army Trail
 - o CVS (closes 10pm)
 - o In strip mall, Pietanza's Italian Restaurant (closes 9pm)
- SW corner of Rt 59 and North Ave
 - Menards (closes 10pm)
 - o Augustino's Rock 'n Roll Deli (closes 9pm)
 - Popeye's Chicken (closes 10pm, take out only, no eat-in)
- NE corner of Rt 59 and North Ave
 - Old Time Pottery and Dollar Tree (both close at 9pm)
 - McDonalds (closes inside at 10, drive-thru closes at 11)

- o Dunkin Donuts/Baskin Robbins (closes 9pm)
- NW corner of Rt 59 and North Ave
 - Mariscos El Vallartazo (closes 10pm)
 - o Los Girasoles (closes 8pm)
- North on Rt 59 past Schick Rd. is a Culver's (closes at 10pm) and nearby, at 1420 S. Rt 59, is a Goodwill store, but it closes earlier at 7pm.
- Further north on Rt 59 (about 6 min from Resurrection) at Stearns Rd
 - Home Depot (closes 10pm)
 - o At that intersection is a Walgreens, MacDonald's, Taco Bell, and Wendy's
