IMPORTANT DATES AND DEADLINES

November 14 – Tuesday evening, 7:30 – 8:30 pm – Black uniform pants for all and Symphonic blue jacket fitting/exchange at the Borows You must sign-up in advance. See Rehearsal Notes for more info.

November 24 - Friday evening - Wheaton Christmas Parade

Gather 5:00pm in parking lot behind Wheaton's City Hall (NW corner Wesley St. and Wheaton Ave.) Step-off 6 pm.

December 7 - Cadets' Winter Performance – Location Marvin Hall upstairs at Resurrection AND Regular practices for Concert Junior, Concert Senior and Symphonic

JACKET AND PANTS FITTING

We hold a jacket and pants fitting *only once a year*. The jackets are for Symphonic members while the pants are available for any band member. After this one and only fitting opportunity everything is packed away and not accessible. This year's fitting date is **Tuesday**, **November 14**, **7:30 - 8:30 pm**. **YOU WILL NEED TO SIGN-UP IF COMING.** The sign-up sheet is at the front table.

The director wishes to emphasize that the band has over 100 pairs of pants to lend. Whether for concerts or looking ahead to marching, you should think about this now as November 14 is the only fitting date. This fitting happens annually. If you are concerned you might need a larger size later in the year she said you can take two pair. You need to sign-up to try them on, on November 14.

NO FOOD AT REHEARSALS!

There is to be ABSOLUTELY no food in Cornelius Hall and beverages are limited to WATER ONLY. That means no coffee or tea, lemonade or soda, etc. **for adults and students alike**.

ATTENTION CADET and JUNIOR BANDS HELP NEEDED on 12/7

The Cadet Performance will be held in Marvin Hall, a larger space, upstairs at Resurrection above Cornelius Hall. Prior to the Performance, help will be needed by Cadet parents. Afterwards help is needed from Junior band and available parents. Cadet parents willing to come would need to arrive around 4pm. The chairs (on the racks) need to be rolled up a ramp and into Marvin Hall. Then they must be set up.

Immediately after the Performance, Junior band and available parents will need to help load the chairs back on the racks, roll them down the ramp into Cornelius Hall and set-up the hall for the remaining evening's rehearsals. Tables may need to be taken down before chairs are set in place.

The director should not be expected to do all of this alone.

PARADE PERCUSSION EQUIPMENT

All those marching the parade need to make sure they have percussion equipment (basses, snares, beaters, cymbals). Take it home with you and bring it back for rehearsals. All equipment must be returned on 11/30.

WHEATON PARADE INSTRUCTIONS

WHEATON LIGHT-A-HOLIDAY PARADE

Friday, November 24 is the Wheaton Light-A-Holiday Parade. We remind you that **all Cadets** as well as **parents and siblings of any band member** are welcome to march with us, behind the band. If you have jingle bells bring them along to shake while you are marching. Instructions follow.

- ALL participants must wear a traditional, plain, Santa hat made of fake fur, red with white trim (large enough to cover ears is good) and normal winter dress outerwear for the parade – dress for the weather.
- Wear dark pants and, ideally, black shoes, to keep a uniform look.
- Mittens that allow you to uncover your fingers would be helpful, or perhaps a pair of gloves with the fingertips cut off, for clarinets. Try playing your instrument at home while wearing them.
- Some find it helpful to bring a bunch of their own **HAND-WARMER PACKETS** in their pockets for keeping both their hands and instruments warm.
- Bring your FLIP-FOLDER AND LYRE, loaded with the songs we are performing.
- A battery-operated clip-light or headband-style light will improve your reading/seeing the music in the dark.
- Those with larger instruments, such as tubas, sousaphones and percussion, please consider decorating your instrument with a battery-operated string of Christmas lights. This is not required but, if you are able to do so, it adds a festive touch to the band's appearance.

We will gather at 5pm in the parking lot behind Wheaton's City Hall (NW corner of Wesley St and Wheaton Ave). Step-off is 6pm. Our unit number will be in the 11/16 Rehearsal Notes along with specifics on where we will dismiss after the parade. The preferred way to enter the parking lot/staging area is to go south on Wheaton Avenue. Do not try to enter the staging area from Hale or Wesley Streets, as you will be redirected. If needed, look for a Wheaton Police Officer or Parade Staging Marshall in an Orange Vest for instructions.

POST-PARADE GATHERING

Band families are invited to gather immediately after the parade at the Portillo's/Barnelli's on North Avenue, one business east of the McDonalds on the southeast corner of North Avenue and Bloomingdale Road; 235 E. North Avenue, Glendale Heights. Just a reminder, given the current situation with lower staff numbers, please be patient as the speed of service may not be what we're accustomed to.

## CADET PERFORMANCE PROGRAM PROOFING

This will help avoid errors in the Performance program.

## \*\*\*\*\*\*CADET DRESS REHEARSAL AND PERFORMANCE\*\*\*\*\*

The Cadet Dress Rehearsal is November 30 at Resurrection in Cornelius Hall and the Performance is on December 7 in Marvin Hall at Resurrection, up the stairs just inside the regular entrance. ALL band members must come to BOTH dressed in CONCERT DRESS. All cadets must arrive at 4:15 for both the Dress Rehearsal and the concert to assist with unloading and set-up so they can be in their seats ready to play by 5:00 at which time we will tune the band. (See item above about help needed requiring earlier arrival time.) CONCERT DRESS includes a plain, button-front white shirt/blouse buttoned to the neck, and black pants/skirt and shoes. Refer to the Handbook, page 14, or the Dress Code on our Forms Documents page, for complete specifics regarding socks, panty hose and acceptable/unacceptable clothing styles. We will be observing your dress for compliance.

## IF YOU ARE NOT DRESSED ACCORDING TO THE DRESS CODE OR ARE LATE YOU MAY NOT BE ALLOWED TO PERFORM.

## ABOUT THE SOLO AND ENSEMBLE CONTEST (SEC)

Our annual Solo and Ensemble Contest is an exciting and much anticipated musical event. Our 23rd annual SEC will be held on a **Saturday, March 16, 2024, 9am to @2:30pm.** Location is Christ Presbyterian Church, 903 E. Nerge Rd., Roselle 60172. ALL band members, Cadet through Symphonic, are encouraged to participate in the SEC. Students have the opportunity to prepare solos and/or ensembles of their choice and perform them for a judge who then rates their performance. There is no competition; rather, students strive for their personal best. Judge's decisions are final.

SEC Online registration will start November 30 and ends January 11, 2024.

All fees are due by February 15, 2024.

**NOTICE:** Fees are \$4 per person (excluding adults) whether solo or ensemble. All entries should not exceed **FIVE** minutes

Due to the complexity involved in scheduling, no special time requests will be granted. Therefore, all members are expected to **reserve their day** for the SEC, ensuring their availability for any/all times. See our SEC webpage for more information.

The director would love to see all members, Cadet through Symphonic, participate and would like to have section leaders (1st chairs) organize others in their sections for an ensemble.

If you need ideas for music to perform go to <a href="JW Pepper">JW Pepper</a>. Click the Departments drop-down menu, then Solo and Ensemble. Another resource is <a href="http://www.stantons.com/">http://www.stantons.com/</a>. On their Home page click on <a href="Instrument">Instrument</a> Solos, Ensembles, <a href="Methods">Methods</a>. Many titles have a recording you can listen to. Another site to try is <a href="https://www.sheetmusicplus.com/">https://www.sheetmusicplus.com/</a>. Or you can Google "Free (insert instrument name) ensembles" Do the same for solos. The band also owns a collection of solos and ensembles which you may borrow by enquiring at the front table. A reminder to Cadets, Juniors and Seniors - You may use a solo from your Essential Element

book if you like. Cadets might consider #118 as your solo or #185 if you learn the necessary new notes. Additional solo and duets are near the back of the book.

Additional information can be found in the two documents whose links are on the SEC webpage. They are "SEC Rules" and "SEC Helpful Hints".

We have had particular recommendations from the judges. These can help guide your choices for solos in particular.

- 1. Preferably, all solo piece(s) would be classical and not contemporary/popular.
- Ideally, all students should play with an accompanist. First choice would be a pianist, second choice a CD.

With point two above in mind, the director also asks that any accomplished pianists in our band consider offering to play as an accompanist for one or more SEC solo entries. Please submit your name at the front table.
