Registration includes a parent signing-up for the required Booster hours on the WSHSB Sign-Up Schedule AND indicating those hours on the registration form. It also includes a completed and signed Commitment page along with all fees and a rental form and fee(s) if applicable. Late fees are applicable after this date. 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# **KEEP PRACTICING DAILY**

# ALL BAND LEVELS - Do not stop your daily practice, WITH RECORDINGS, during the Thanksgiving break!

Hone in on your trouble spots and those areas pointed out in the weekly music notes. Eliminate wrong notes and rhythms and improve dynamics.

# **INSTRUMENT REPAIRS NEEDED?**

If you are not marching in the Wheaton parade and your instrument needs a tune-up or repair, take advantage of the long break and have it done now.

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# ATTENTION CADET and JUNIOR BANDS HELP NEEDED on 12/7

The Cadet Performance will be held in Marvin Hall, a larger space, upstairs at Resurrection above Cornelius Hall. Prior to the Performance, help will be needed by Cadet parents. Afterwards help is

needed from Junior band and available parents. Cadet parents willing to come would need to arrive around 4pm. The chairs (on the racks) need to be rolled up a ramp and into Marvin Hall. Then they must be set up.

Immediately after the Performance, Junior band and available parents will need to help load the chairs back on the racks, roll them down the ramp into Cornelius Hall and set-up the hall for the remaining evening's rehearsals. Tables may need to be taken down before chairs are set in place.

The director should not be expected to do all of this alone.

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WHEATON PARADE INSTRUCTIONS

WHEATON LIGHT-A-HOLIDAY PARADE

Friday, November 24 is the Wheaton Light-A-Holiday Parade. We remind you that **all Cadets** as well as **parents and siblings of any band member** are welcome to march with us, behind the band. If you have jingle bells bring them along to shake while you are marching. Instructions follow.

- ALL participants must wear a traditional, plain, Santa hat made of fake fur, red with white trim (large enough to cover ears is good) and normal winter dress outerwear for the parade dress for the weather.
- Wear dark pants and, ideally, black shoes, to keep a uniform look.
- Mittens that allow you to uncover your fingers would be helpful, or perhaps a pair of gloves with the fingertips cut off, for clarinets. Try playing your instrument at home while wearing them.
- Some find it helpful to bring a bunch of their own **HAND-WARMER PACKETS** in their pockets for keeping both their hands and instruments warm.
- Bring your FLIP-FOLDER AND LYRE, loaded with the songs we are performing.
- A battery-operated clip-light or headband-style light will improve your reading/seeing the music in the dark.
- Those with larger instruments, such as tubas, sousaphones and percussion, please consider decorating your instrument with a battery-operated string of Christmas lights. This is not required but, if you are able to do so, it adds a festive touch to the band's appearance.

We will gather at 5pm in the parking lot behind Wheaton's City Hall (NW corner of Wesley St and Wheaton Ave). Step-off is 6pm. Our unit number is 42. The preferred way to enter the parking lot/staging area is to go south on Wheaton Avenue. Do not try to enter the staging area from Hale or Wesley Streets, as you will be redirected. If needed, look for a Wheaton Police Officer or Parade Staging Marshall in an Orange Vest for instructions.

The parade route is south on Wheaton Ave. and east on Front St. to Cross St. While the parade ends at Front and Cross streets, we will continue marching north on Cross, across Wesley into the Wheaton Library plaza. We will disperse from there.

POST-PARADE GATHERING

Band families are invited to gather immediately after the parade at the Portillo's/Barnelli's on North Avenue, one business east of the McDonalds on the southeast corner of North Avenue and Bloomingdale Road; 235 E. North Avenue, Glendale Heights. Just a reminder, given the current situation with lower staff numbers, please be patient as the speed of service may not be what we're accustomed to.

# \*\*\*\*\*\*CADET DRESS REHEARSAL AND PERFORMANCE\*\*\*\*\*\*

The Cadet Dress Rehearsal is November 30 at Resurrection in Cornelius Hall and the Performance is on December 7 in Marvin Hall at Resurrection, up the stairs just inside the regular entrance. ALL band members must come to BOTH dressed in CONCERT DRESS. All cadets must arrive at 4:15 for both the Dress Rehearsal and the concert to assist with unloading and set-up so they can be in their seats ready to play by 5:00 at which time we will tune the band. (See item above about help needed requiring earlier arrival time.) CONCERT DRESS includes a plain, button-front white shirt/blouse buttoned to the neck, and black pants/skirt and shoes. Refer to the Handbook, page 14, or the Dress Code on our Forms Documents page, for complete specifics regarding socks, panty hose and acceptable/unacceptable clothing styles. We will be observing your dress for compliance.

## IF YOU ARE NOT DRESSED ACCORDING TO THE DRESS CODE OR ARE LATE YOU MAY NOT BE ALLOWED TO PERFORM.

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We will use podium etiquette at all rehearsals through the Performance Director steps off podium – Instruments down Director steps on podium – Instruments upright, to one side Director raises arms – Instruments up in playing position

FOR HOMEWORK -

NOTICE TO ALL CADETS:

- All instruments cases must be stored on or under the tables. None should be stored by your seat where the band rehearses.
- Stop playing when the director is talking AND when she stops directing. Watch director carefully!
- ESPECIALLY PERCUSSION: Avoid making stray noises at the dress rehearsal and concert.
- 1. There will be no new material assigned until the Christmas break. Use this time to catch up if needed, reviewing all notes covered, thus far. **Especially** work on ALL performance songs.
- 2. All percussionists continue watching for emails from Mrs. Talbot.
- 3. Practice these songs daily for Cadet Performance

Our annual Solo and Ensemble Contest is an exciting and much anticipated musical event. Our 23rd annual SEC will be held on a **Saturday, March 16, 2024, 9am to @2:30pm.** Location is Christ Presbyterian Church, 903 E. Nerge Rd., Roselle 60172. ALL band members, Cadet through Symphonic, are encouraged to participate in the SEC. Students have the opportunity to prepare solos and/or ensembles of their choice and perform them for a judge who then rates their performance. There is no competition; rather, students strive for their personal best. Judge's decisions are final.

Due to the complexity involved in scheduling, **no special time requests will be granted**. Therefore, all members are expected to **reserve their day** for the SEC, ensuring their availability for any/all times. See our SEC webpage for more information.

The director would love to see all members, Cadet through Symphonic, participate and would like to have section leaders (1st chairs) organize others in their sections for an ensemble.

A number of things have changed from past years. Please read carefully.

All entries should not exceed FIVE minutes

SEC Online registration starts November 30 and will end January 11, 2024. Use this link -SEC REGISTRATION LINK

You must indicate Solo or Ensemble on the registration. If Ensemble is chosen, the form will then allow spaces for all participants' names, etc.

- A confirmation email will be sent for each entry to the main contact provided.
- You must **also print** all your applicable Judging Sheet(s) from the following list and complete the top section with your information. Forms can be found on both our SEC and FORMS/DOCUMENTS web pages
 - 1. SEC Wood/Brass Solo
 - 2. SEC Wood/Brass Ensemble
 - 3. SEC Percussion Solo
 - 4. SEC Percussion Ensemble
- Fees are \$4 per person (excluding adults) whether solo or ensemble.
- Required SEC Fees are payable at the front table at band. **Payment by check is preferred.** All fees must be turned-in with your completed Judging sheet(s) in a business-sized envelope with your name and the name of the piece you or your group are performing. **No change for cash can be made at band.**
- Only one person should register for an entire ensemble. That one person should collect the ensemble fee from each student (not adults), complete the Ensemble Judging Sheet, and turn all in, in one envelope

Deadline for ALL fees and completed Judging Sheet(s) is February 15, 2024. NO ONE WILL BE SCHEDULED until all their fee(s) and completed Judging Sheet(s) are received.

ALL SOLOS MUST HAVE ACCOMPANIMENT

While the only acceptable instrument is piano, a CD is allowed. Solos without accompaniment will be allowed to perform, but will be judged for comments only and no award will be given. **IMPORTANT**: Participants using recorded accompaniment will need to supply their own Bluetooth speaker or CD player.
